

**MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING
CITY COUNCIL OF THE

A special meeting of the City Council for the City of Bay Lake was called to order on Friday, October 9, 2020 at 9:01 A.M., at 1900 Hotel Plaza Boulevard, Lake Buena Vista, Florida.

Those present via phone were Mayor Todd Watzel, Council Members Wendy Duncan, Bryan Swartz, Joel Edwards, and Mark Krause constituting a Council. Others present were John Classe, City Manager; Jerry Wooldridge, Assistant City Manager; Tina Graham, City Clerk; Susan Higginbotham, City Auditor; Chris Quinn, RCID Finance Director; via phone, Ann Blakeslee, City Manager of Lake Buena Vista; and Ed Milgrim, Milgrim Law Group.

A consideration to adopt **Ordinance No. 136** to extend the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold, consumed or served, or permitted to be sold, consumed and served at designated location within the city to between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 5:00 A.M. of the following day, from October 9, 2020 to October 14, 2020 was made by Joel Edwards, duly seconded by Mark Krause, and approved by all attending Council members. ORDINANCE NO. 136

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BAY LAKE, FLORIDA, EXTENDING THE HOURS DURING WHICH ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE SOLD, CONSUMED OR SERVED, OR PERMITTED TO BE SERVED OR CONSUMED, AT DESIGNATED LICENSED PREMISES FROM OCTOBER 9 THROUGH OCTOBER 14, 2020; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Section 562.14, Florida Statutes, bans alcoholic beverage sales, consumption, and service between the hours of midnight to 7 A.M. of the following day, and authorizes municipalities to further regulate these hours by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bay Lake (the "City") passed Ordinance Number 52 (the "Ordinance"), effective January 3, 1994, establishing the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold, consumed, served or permitted to be served or consumed within the City every day of the week between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 2:00 A.M. of the following day, with certain exceptions allowing service until 3:00 A.M.; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds and determines that adopting this Emergency Ordinance will meet a public emergency affecting life, health, property, or the public peace as provided in Section 27 of the City Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, that:

Section 1. Incorporation. All findings and statements set forth in the preamble to this Emergency Ordinance, including the definition of all terms therein, are incorporated herein by reference, as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Authority. This Emergency Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the applicable provisions of Florida law, including without limitation Section 27 of the City Charter and Section 166.041(3)(b), Florida Statutes.

Section 3. Extended Hours October 9-14, 2020. The City Council hereby extends the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold, consumed, served or permitted to be served or consumed, anywhere at Disney's Coronado Springs Resort, during the period from October 9, 2020 to October 14, 2020 (inclusive), to between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 5:00 A.M. the following day.

Section 4. Public Emergency. The City Council hereby finds and determines that the COVID-19 pandemic is a public emergency affecting life, health, property, or the public peace, and that the adoption of this Emergency Ordinance will protect those within the City by limiting interaction between individuals currently lodging at Disney's Coronado Springs Resort and those not currently lodging at Disney's Coronado Springs Resort on the dates listed herein.

Section 5. Severability. If any one or more of the covenants, agreements or provisions of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, then such covenants, agreements or provisions shall be null and void and shall be deemed separate from the remaining covenants, agreements or provisions of this Emergency Ordinance, which remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. Effective Date. The provisions of this Emergency Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the date of its adoption by the City Council.
