Walt Disney World Resort Complex Petroleum and Chemical Storage Tank Permitting Requirements

Timeline: up to 2 months prior to placing the generator/tank on the concrete pad (permanent location)

Fuel Storage Tank Permitting: All fuel storage tanks greater than 550 gallons (stand alone or part of a generator set) must be registered with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) <u>prior</u> to installing.

- Tank and system components (piping, gauges, fittings, etc.) must be on the FDEP's Approved Equipment List.
- Orange County Environmental Protection Division (OCEPD), acting as agents for the FDEP, must be
 notified 30 to 45 days prior to tank installation. This includes replacing, upgrading, adding or
 removing a storage tank.
- OCEPD must be notified again <u>48 to 72 hours</u> prior to installation or removal, to schedule an inspection.
- The tank must be pressure tested <u>prior to filling</u>.
- The tank's safety components (gauges, alarms, etc.) must be tested for operability prior to filling.
- WDW Environmental Control will make all communications with OCEPD and the FDEP.

Chemical Storage Tank Permitting: All chemical storage tanks with a capacity of 110 gallons or greater designed to hold chemicals or any mixture of chemicals must be registered with the FDEP <u>prior to installing</u>.

- Tank and system components (piping, gauges, fittings, etc.) must be on the FDEP's Approved Equipment List.
- OCEPD, acting as agents for the FDEP, must be notified at least <u>30 to 45 days</u> before installation.
 This includes replacing, upgrading, adding or removing any storage tank.
- OCEPD must be notified again 48 to 72 hours prior to installation to schedule an inspection.
- Tank system must be certified to have secondary containment by Florida registered P.E.
- WDW Environmental Control will make all communications with OCEPD and the FDEP.

Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure (SPCC): The U.S. EPA requires all oil containing equipment or containers with a capacity of 55-gallons or more be included (and depicted) in a SPCC plan. <u>Oil means</u> oil of any kind including, petroleum, fuel oil, hydraulic and motor oil, greases, vegetable and cooking oil. Please provide Environmental Control the following information <u>30 days prior to installation</u>:

- A listing of all oil containers, tanks or equipment with an oil capacity of 55-gallons or more.
- The contents, size, construction material and secondary containment volume of each container.
- Ensure all oil containers must be located inside a building or in secondary containment that can hold at least 110% of the single largest container
- A drawing showing the location of each container.

Additional Information:

- Each fuel and chemical storage location shall provide and maintain a spill kit that is specific to the type and quantity of the chemicals stored.
- Future petroleum and chemical storage locations shall be coordinated with Environmental Affairs to ensure appropriate wellhead protection, floodplain and wetland setback restrictions.
